

## Dependent Care FSA Worksheet

A flexible spending account allows you to use pre-tax dollars to pay for certain dependent care expenses. By contributing pre-tax dollars to a reimbursement account, you lower your taxable income; therefore, you pay less in taxes and increase your spendable income.

Use this worksheet to help you estimate the eligible dependent care expenses that you will incur during the plan year (January through December) as a result of your employment. If you are married both you and your spouse must be working (unless your spouse is a full-time student or disabled). This is not an all inclusive listing of eligible expenses, but contains some of the most common expenses. \*The maximum that you can contribute to your dependent care FSA is \$5,000 per calendar year. If you are you are married and filing jointly the maximum is \$5,000 and \$2,500 if you are married and filing separately.
