

## Health Care FSA Worksheet

A flexible spending account allows you to use pre-tax dollars to pay for certain health care expenses. By contributing pre-tax dollars to a reimbursement account, you lower your taxable income; therefore, you pay less in taxes and increase your spendable income.

Use this worksheet to help you estimate the eligible health care expenses that you and your eligible dependents may incur during the plan year (January through December) that are not fully covered by an insurance plan. These expenses cannot be reimbursed by another plan. This is not an all inclusive listing of eligible expenses, but contains some of the most common expenses.
