Kathleen Sprows Cummings is Professor of American Studies and History at the University of Notre Dame, where she also serves as the William W. and Anna Jean Cushwa Director of the Cushwa Center for the Study of American Catholicism. Cummings was recently announced as the 2021 winner of the Sheedy Award for Excellence in Teaching. Cummings teaches classes on the history of women, Catholicism, and American religion at the University of Notre Dame. In addition to directing the Cushwa Center, Cummings oversees the Conference on the History of Women Religious, an academic organization devoted to the historical study of Catholic sisters. She is also the author of *A Saint of Our Own: How the Quest for a Holy Hero Helped Catholics Become American* and the *New Women of the Old Faith: Gender and American Catholicism in the Progressive Era*.
